A COLLABORATIVE APPROACH FOR PLANNING & GROWTH

Public facilities and services are essential throughout the City and are permitted in all ten Charlotte Place Types. As Charlotte-Mecklenburg continues to grow and develop, timely planning and coordination of public facilities and services is essential to maintaining the high quality of life that residents expect.

The Community Area Planning process involved key public service providers, including water and sewer, stormwater, police, fire, parks, and schools, to ensure all agencies had access to consistent growth projections and understood how growth would be distributed across the City, as outlined in the Charlotte Future 2040 Policy Map. By utilizing a shared data set, providers can identify highgrowth areas and align their system planning to meet future demands. This collaborative approach enables each provider to maintain existing public facilities and effectively plan for future needs.
